

Food & Fellowship: A Match Made in Heaven!

In May we focused our weekly reflection on our Small Group network. This month our attention turns to the three monthly ministries directed towards the adult members of our community - all of which revolve around food!

At First Thursday we hold a short, traditional service, followed by a wholesome lunch with time to chat afterwards. The origins of a men's breakfast dates back to a men's weekend away led by the late Rev Jim McNaughton (then Associate Minister of NBC), on a farm near Newbury some 27 years ago. Some of the membership can still remember it! What followed was a monthly breakfast for men.

The format hasn't really changed in a quarter of a century, although with websites and smart phones it's become easier to book and know who is coming or not. We've even been known to go for an early morning walk (sometimes involving prayer), ending up at a local café for our much-needed breakfast. But nothing can surpass a solid fry up! (A veggie option is available: We just remove the sausage, bacon & black pudding – vegan's can also drop the egg...) We usually follow this with a speaker sharing on a wide range of topics. We've had car designers turned vicars, lifelong missionaries ...even husbands of ministers!

More often than not, we have one of our own sharing a passion and their own walk with Christ. It's true we have had some record-breaking long talks, but we try and encourage the speaker to keep to about 10min as we are aware it's important to get our men back to their families on a busy Saturday morning. For those who want extra fellowship there is always the washing up to help with.

We've lost some friends over the years, notably Glyn Morgan who had a regular spot sharing a joke or a ditty to raise a smile. The rest of us seem to have just grown older gracefully, that's not to say we aren't welcoming to youngsters – dad's are more than welcome to bring their charges with them whatever the age and gender. Now we bet that's given some wives an idea – yes! Why not encourage your man to take the kids off nice and early to breakfast and you can enjoy a peaceful Saturday morning once a month. It's certainly a thought that has merit.

If you've never been before, come and join us and your first breakfast is FREE, on us! Alternatively, it's a great event to bring along someone new or a friend as a way of introducing them to church life and a faith in Jesus. Let us know before hand and your guest comes FREE.
