#### West Berkshire Foodbank

As we approach the school holidays, families should be looking forward to a time of joy and relaxation. However for many this brings the worry of putting food on the table. When schools close, free school meals stop. For the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, West Berks Foodbank is addressing this issue with the Hungry Holidays project. So far, 46 schools across West Berkshire have identified families that that they know are going to be struggling over the summer holidays - meaning the foodbank will be providing support to at least 478 households. # Prayer Space

## Praying for Peace in our World



Heavenly Father, we come before you with hearts that are both heavy and hopeful. We look around our world today and see so much brokenness – the ongoing conflicts that seem to drag on without end, the divisions that run through communities and nations, the fear and uncertainty that touches so many lives.

Lord, we think of those places where war rages on, where families are separated and children grow up knowing only conflict. We pray for wisdom for world leaders as they navigate these troubled waters, that they might choose the path of dialogue over destruction, understanding over retaliation. Give them courage to make the difficult decisions that lead to lasting peace rather than temporary victories.

We pray too for our own community here in Britain, Father, in a time when it feels like we're more divided than ever – over politics, over values, over the future we want to build together – help us to remember that we are all your children. Teach us to listen more than we speak, to seek common ground rather than highlighting our differences, and to be peacemakers in our own neighbourhoods and workplaces.

Lord Jesus, you called us to be salt and light in this world. Help us to live that out practically – to be the ones who build bridges instead of walls, who offer hope instead of despair, who choose love even when it's costly. When we're tempted to retreat into our own comfortable circles, remind us that your kingdom includes people from every nation, tribe and tongue.

We pray for those who are suffering right now because of conflict and violence. Comfort those who mourn, heal those who are wounded in body and spirit, and provide for those who have lost everything. Use us, Lord, to be your hands and feet in bringing relief and restoration wherever we can.

Father, we know that true peace isn't just the absence of war – it's your shalom, your wholeness, breaking into our broken world. We long for that day when swords will be beaten into ploughshares, when justice will roll down like waters, and when every tear will be wiped away. Until that day comes, help us to be faithful witnesses to your peace, starting right here, right now, in the way we treat one another. We pray this in the name of Jesus, our Saviour, amen.

## Remembering Brueggemann

Last weekend, the renowned Old Testament scholar Walter Brueggemann died aged 92. Widely considered one of the most influential theologians of the last 50 years, much of his work drew upon the Hebrew prophetic tradition, arguing that the church should be a counter-narrative to the dominant forces of consumerism and nationalism in the world. Below is one of his prayers which you may find helpful to say and reflect upon:

Save us, Lord, from a religion that ignores the cries of the exploited and oppressed. Lead us into a deeper faith that challenges injustice and makes the sacrifices that must be made to build a society that is ever more truly human. Amen.
