The Cost of Community

On Sunday I shared the incredibly sad and unexpected death of one of our much-loved members, Lyn.

As I looked around at the congregation there was a visceral reaction etched on the faces of many. Shock, upset, tearfulness. Among those that already knew, including Lyn's small group, there was an air of heaviness from the moment they stepped foot through the door. We are a church family in mourning.

This is the cost of community. The cost of walking together as sisters and brothers in Christ.

Because in times like these we are reminded that what binds us together is not simply a shared interest or sense of humour. We are bound by the Living God - Jesus himself - and the deeper we allow those bonds to grow, the stronger the connection we feel towards each other. Of course this is true of any kind of relationship in life. But what makes the relationship between followers of Jesus unique is that through the Holy Spirit at work in each other's lives, we catch glimpses of God.

For those who knew Lyn, it was not difficult to catch glimpses of God when in her presence. A gentle welcome and reassuring smile when she served on the front door on Sundays. Quiet and unseen acts of kindness and care, known only to the recipients, which made her such an asset to the pastoral team.

When we live in community and commit ourselves to the life of the church, as well as to God, there is much joy to be found. For the vast majority we are usually able to give and contribute without needing much in return. But there will be times when life gets tough. When we experience loss or hardship. And in those moments we see the power of what it means to be bound together by Christ.

I pray for God's comfort for us all at this time, and for God to bring comfort through the support we show each other.
