The Joy of Baggy Trousers

A few days ago the girls were putting on their pyjamas, when Mia exclaimed "I've got baggy trousers!" To which I replied "that's the name of a song!" For some reason this induced a great fit of the giggles, so obviously I then had to get my phone out and play them the 1980 hit from *Madness*.

I should've known I'd roped myself into endless renditions and requests to play it again, and at the time of writing the novelty factor hasn't worn off...yet. (Ask me again next week though...!)

Their joy from something so simple got me thinking again about the theme of Sunday's sermon "A Liberating Life" based on Romans 8:1-17. The passage is Paul's introduction to what life as believer of Jesus should look like - a life filled with the Holy Spirit.

We explored this from four different angles, each one expressing a form of freedom which God desires for us in the here and now, and not just when we reach heaven's gates. One thing we didn't cover was something the Spirit also brings, and is perhaps a by-product of freedom in Christ: Joy.

Joy isn't just something reserved for special occasions. It's something which can be found amidst the ordinary, daily humdrum of life, because those are also the times and places where God can be found. Psalm 16:11 says: "In your presence there is fullness of joy". We are reminded in Galatians that joy is a fruit of the Spirit, and therefore is something we should expect to feel if we are leading a life in the Spirit.

Of course, none of us will always feel joyful - despite Paul's encouragement to the Philippians to "rejoice in

the Lord always, again I say, rejoice." That sense of joy ebbs and flows. Sometimes it takes us by surprise - a *Baggy Trousers* moment of joy. But there will be other times where we experience joy as a consequence of intentionally seeking the Lord and dwelling in his presence.

I would argue this is especially important when we are going through a tough time, because it is precisely in those moments that we need holding, lifting and reminding that God is with us, is always faithful, and is capable of evoking emotions within us which seem at odds with the circumstances around us.

I continue to pray that we might earnestly approach God with a desire to be renewed by the Spirit, and in turn experience the joy of what it means to be free in Christ. May God bless you this week.
