Lightning Squad - a hit!

You'll know the moment, on a Sunday morning, when half the church heads gets up and heads out the wooden door at the front... If you're bound for Lightning Squad, the fun is just beginning. But if you're left in the service, you might sometimes wonder: what do they even do out there? Well, here's a peek into the session formerly known as Chattabox, for children aged 5-11...

Our aim for Lightning Squad is threefold. We want the children to feel loved and part of the church family, we want them to build friendships with one another, and we want them to learn one thing (at least) about God each week.

So if you stepped into a Sunday session, you might find the children sharing something about their week, watching a Bible story video, or playing keepy-uppies with a balloon. They might be acting out a scene from Scripture, retelling the Bible's big story with props – or spinning each other round on a giant parachute in a game called 'washing machine' (don't ask!).

Since September, our age range has narrowed and we've switched to a new resource-provider. There are nine regular volunteers (three on each week), and we usually have about 12-16 children, with some weeks busier than others.

The Lightning Squad children are brilliant; engaged, fun and always full of energy. We love their insights, honesty and curiosity. Some weeks, they remember every single detail about a Bible story. Other times, they'll recollect the gist at best. They ask questions like, 'what colour is the Holy Spirit,' and share wonderful perspectives on faith. We can see real friendships emerging, and it's particularly encouraging to see how the younger children look up to the older ones.
