

## Into the Rabbit Hole

Is it too late to be saying Happy New Year? Possibly, but I don't think it'll prompt a flood of complaints into my inbox!

Speaking of inboxes, for those of you following our new sermon series 'Get in the Bible', I've opened a potentially giant can of worms by inviting you to send me the questions you have about the Bible. However, the response has been pretty tame thus far, so if you've been meaning to get in touch then please do! There are also plenty of bookmarks left from Sunday (perhaps that says something about my sermon! If you've not taken one then please do - it'll at least make me think they were helpful!)

I often find reading God's Word a bit like the rabbit hole in *Alice in Wonderland*. Once I stick my head inside it feels like I've been transported to a different place. Sometimes I feel like I'm lost in a strange or complex world. Sometimes it's like I'm being challenged to suspend the things I think I know, in order to have my eyes, heart and mind opened up to something completely new.

What is always important though, is that we return from the rabbit hole, back into 'the real world', where we can put whatever we've learned into practice. If we don't do that then we're probably either getting stuck in purely academic study of scripture to the point of it becoming an abstract exercise. Or we fail to really 'get stuck in', and never go beyond a superficial reading and understanding.

In some ways there's nothing wrong with taking the latter approach. I have met many people over the years who have what some might consider a simplistic faith, yet God often speaks through them. However the Bible recognises that for many, especially mature believers, there is a responsibility to deepen our knowledge. Hebrews 5:12-14 distinguishes teaching between "milk" and "solid food", with the mature believers expected to be on "solids". This metaphor is repeated by Paul in 1 Corinthians 3, and suggests he altered his teaching methods accordingly.

Even Jesus himself recognised that we all have differing levels of ability and can handle different amounts of responsibility. The parable of the Talents in Matthew 25 is a good example and worth re-reading.

As we continue to Get *into the Bible* this term, my hope and prayer is that you will each find something to help you go a little deeper, and in turn discover something new in your experience of God's character, purpose, and call upon your life.
