

Living Water - and blocked drains!

I'm very much a night-owl. Ask me something at 7am and you might not get a sensible answer (or indeed any answer other than a grunt!) ask me to do something at 10pm and I'll be there full of beans and wide awake.

So imagine how I felt this morning when I had to get up early to come to church and meet a contractor to look at a blocked drain. Not the most excited I've ever been! It was raining and obviously the drain was not in a nice, accessible part of the building, but round the back, through locked gates and a mucky path.

I retreated to make coffee while the contractor worked on the drain and thankfully solved the issue without too much bother. And while I was drinking the coffee, and slowly waking up, I thought about something that happened this week and how surprisingly similar it was to that drain....

In one of the churches in the group I worked as administrator before coming to NBC we do some outreach work with schools. A small team delivers collective worship in school every week, and a few times a year we invite the schools into the church. It's great fun, and gives me an opportunity to share my faith with 200 young people at a time, it builds relationships with the church and local families.

But this week, the team had a wake up call - you see what we though was going well we realised wasn't quite hitting the mark. Although we speak to 200 children every week, a small group of children with special needs are not accessing the collective worship sessions. It's just too loud, or too long for them to sit for, or too difficult for them to understand, and they're missing out on Jesus. Despite our best intentions, there was a "blockage". We were pouring out the Good News, but it wasn't getting through.

Just like the drain at church, the problem wasn't the water itself — and it certainly wasn't the children. The blockage was something we had helped create, without meaning to. We had to get our hands dirty and clear it! We're now looking at what we can do to meet those children where they are, and share our faith with them in a way that suits them, not us.

Jesus was the ultimate "drain un-blocker" He broke through social barriers, religious rules and assumptions so that when he spoke, everyone - from the children to the scholars - were included.

It made me wonder, might there be other blockages that I haven't yet noticed? And what might God be inviting us to "clear" so that his living water can reach more people?

Praying for Ukraine

Many in our church family have been blessed to know Sasha, Katya and their family since they moved to Newbury from Ukraine at the outbreak of Russia's invasion. They have asked for specific prayers for their home city of Cherkassy, which was attacked last week, with a bomb damaging property and a number of people injured. Temperatures are dropping to as low as -20, and there is little electricity, so it is a deeply worrying time.

Loving God, we bring before you our dear brother and sister in Christ, Sasha and Katya, and their family. We thank you for the blessing and encouragement they have been to NBC since they moved to the UK. We join them in lamenting the ongoing war in Ukraine, and especially the recent attack on their home town of Cherkassy.

We ask that you would bring comfort to those whose homes and businesses have been damaged or destroyed by the bombing, and swift healing to those injured in the attacks. We pray for proper aid and services to be provided, and that electric power can be fully returned. In these winter months we think especially of those who are vulnerable, and pray for you to shelter them under your loving arms.

As we think of the ongoing violence across Ukraine, we once again ask for you to bring peace and justice. May your Spirit intervene and change the minds of those at the negotiating table, in order for a ceasefire to hold and a lasting peace plan to be agreed. We ask this in the name of Jesus, amen.
